Happy New Year

Happy New Year to you all; I hope you enjoyed a good break over the Christmas period. It was lovely to see so many children return to school after the holiday with a big smile on their faces and a positive, 'can do' attitude; we are looking forward to a busy half term.

2016 Results

Many of you will have seen the local primary league tables which were published in The Evening Telegraph just before Christmas and may have been surprised at where we came. We felt it would be useful for you to have a little more insight into our results from last year.

During the external writing moderation process from the Local Authority in May 2016, we became aware that the portfolio of independent writing evidence collected for each pupil was not sufficient to securely award marks for some pupils. This meant that many pupils could not be awarded the 'met' standard from the new national assessment framework. Although writing outcomes were therefore low, maths and reading were on a par with local schools, but the published results amalgamate the outcomes of reading, writing and maths, indicating the percentage of pupils who have achieved the expected standard in all 3 areas, therefore our results look to have dropped.

As you will be aware, since September, we have moved away from our original writing process which has enabled us to widen the evidence we use to assess, to avoid this happening again. We have also included more opportunities to develop handwriting, punctuation, spelling and grammar. The move away from only basing assessment on cold pieces of writing has enabled us to adapt planning more appropriately and respond more quickly to the needs of the class. It has also given pupils more opportunity to edit and improve work independently before final teacher assessment. Success criteria is now more clearly linked to assessment grids and the school is also moving towards addressing any issues with letter formation, joining etc through looking at the introduction of pre-cursive and cursive writing in the infants. We have also invested in a new spelling programme which is being trialled in Years 2 and 3, with a view to rolling it out to the rest of KS2. The school is eager to embrace any training and support offered by the local authority and is enrolled in a new development programme for reading and writing in KS1 and KS2, which begins this term.

We hope that as parents, you know that we will never be complacent about pupils' aspirations and will continue to set challenging targets for all pupils to achieve. 2017 outcomes should see the attainment in writing once more in line with reading and maths, as it has been in previous years.

Absence
