## Useful vocabulary

<b>consumer</b>	A person who buys and uses goods and services.
<b>career</b>	The work or job that someone does.
<b>fair trade</b>	Helps people, who make things in developing countries, sell their goods for a fair price.
<b>finance</b>	The money available to a government, business or individual.
<b>profit</b>	The amount of money made by a company/individual when they sell goods.
<b>tax</b>	Money that people have to pay to the government. The government uses this money to pay for things.
