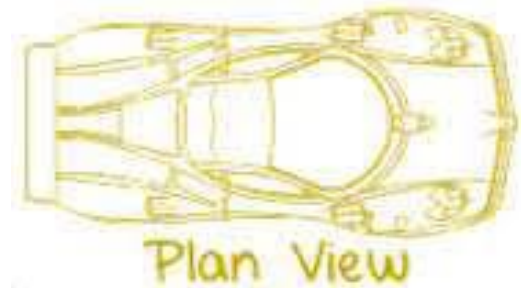
Vocabulary you will know...

Aerial view	The term aerial view can refer to any view from a great height or directly from above.
Plan view	The appearance of an object from above.
Side View	The appearance of an object from the side.
Symbols	A simple drawing that represents another meaning.
Key	A collection of signs and symbols and their meanings.
Orientate	To move a map or plan in accordance to the points of a compass.
Human features	A part of the landscape which has been created by human activity.
Scale	The relationship between a map and distance on the ground.
Physical features	A part of the landscape which has been created by natural means.
Ordnance Survey	The national mapping agency for Great Britain.
Grid reference	A system of lines and numbers used to plot a location on a map
