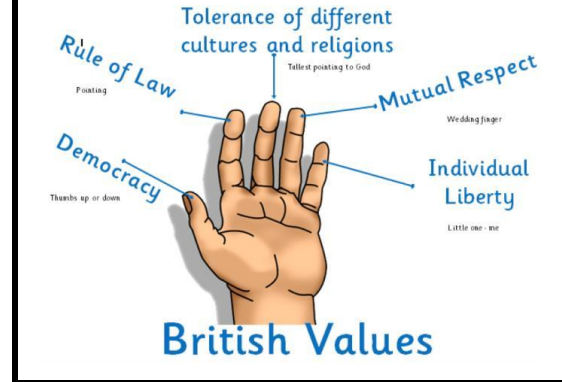

| Rules | A direction that guides behaviour, action and choices. |

| Dislikes | Something that does not appeal to you. |
| Interests | Something that you enjoy doing, learning or taking part in. |
| Beliefs | Something that you believe to be true. |
| Identify | The set of qualities and beliefs that make one person. |
| Self-esteem | Your self-worth and how you see yourself. |
| Praise | Expression of approval for achievement. |
| Community | A group of people with a common factor. |
| British Values | The values which underpin what it means to be a British citizen. They include: democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance. |
