Science in Y5

In year 5, we have recently been learning about forces in Science. We learnt that a force is a push or a pull. Some forces (which we know of) are gravity, friction, air resistance and water resistance. If there was no gravity, we would be floating because gravity pulls us towards the centre of the Earth. We did an experiment using jelly and chopsticks to see the impact friction has on objects. We discovered that friction is a force that slows moving objects down! Finally, our parachute experiment taught us that air resistance is a force that acts against gravity and slows objects and people down; this is why a sky diver relies on their parachute to catch the air resistance to slow them down.


Science - In 5H we have been learning about forces such as gravity, upthrust, air and water resistance. We have also been learning about mechanisms like pulleys, levers and gears.


