Mrs Halliday thanked all representatives for gathering the ideas from their class peers and presenting the findings.

Action: Mrs Halliday to talk to Mrs Gerver and Mr Welsh about Non-uniform as well as talk to Mrs Branch / Mrs Wright (PE Leads) to see if a Sponsored Rammy Mile could be completed on Children in Need Day.

2. To review the Child Friendly Anti-bullying Policy

Mrs Halliday explained that at MPS, we want to make sure that the children feel looked after, safe and happy when they are in and out of school. Mrs Halliday explained that in school we have policies which are written to guide school staff, parents and children. Mrs Halliday shared the Child Friendly Anti-bullying Policy 2022 with the children and explained that the school council were going to help her update and review the policy to check that it makes sense and whether any important information had been missed out. Mrs Halliday displayed the policy on the white-board and read through the policy. After each paragraph the

school council discussed whether the paragraph made sense or not.

All children felt the policy was written in a clear and easy to understand way. All children knew the STOP acronym used within the policy (Several Times On Purpose) but many juniors were unsure about the START acronym (Start Telling And Reporting Trouble).

Action: Mrs Halliday to include START as part of the Anti-bullying week timetable of learning – Y3 to be introduced to the acronym, Y4, Y5 and Y6 to re-visit. No changes to be made to the policy document for 2023.

3. To present each member with their School Council Badges

Each member of the School Council was given a badge. The children will wear the badges with pride and at the end of the year will keep them as a token of their involvement within the School Council at MPS 22-23
