That in the late 1830s the majority of the British population was living and working in the countryside. New ways of farming and the creation of farming machinery was key to people moving to towns and cities. The Industrial Revolution was a time of great change in society. The factory system was developed enabling the manufacture of goods quickly and cheaply. Transport links improved increasing the ability to trade between different areas of the country.
