


Title: Difference & Diversity



**Vocabulary you will know...**

<b>discrimination</b>	the unfair treatment of a person or a group of people based on their characteristics.
<b>prejudice</b>	to pre-judge a person based on a group they belong to
<b>stereotype</b>	to assume a person will do or behave in a particular way based on a group they belong to
<b>gender identity</b>	to describe how a person feels about their gender
<b>transgender</b>	used to describe a person who feels their gender is different from the sex they were registered when they were born.
<b>gay</b>	used to describe a person who falls in love with or who wants to have a relationship with a person of the same gender e.g. a man who loves another man, a woman who loves another woman.
<b>lesbian</b>	used to describe a woman who falls in love with or who wants to have a relationship with another woman
<b>heterosexual</b>	used to describe a person who falls in love with or who wants to have a relationship with a person of the opposite gender to them e.g. a man who falls in love with a woman.



**In this PSHE Unit, we shall celebrate our differences and consider what makes us unique. We shall explore prejudice and discrimination using real life examples such as Rosa Parks and August Pullman (Wonder). As well as exploring gender stereotypes, we shall learn the definitions of some words and consider whether these words are used in a respectful way.**
