- I know the Earth spins on its axis once every 24 hours and that gives us day and night.
- I know that it takes one year (365 days and a quarter) for the Earth to make one complete orbit of the sun.
- I know that the tilt of the Earth is responsible for the seasons.
- I know that when it is winter in one part of the world it is summer in another.
- I know that the Moon orbits the Earth once every 28 days.
- I can explain the pattern in the Moon's appearance over 28 days.
- I know there are 8 planets in our Solar System.
- I can name the planets and I can recognise some of the features of each planet.


Famous People
