- 1820 Florence Nightingale was born on the 12th May
- 1851 Florence Nightingale became a nurse.
- 1853 The Crimean War broke out.
- 1854 Florence Nightingale went to Turkey to help the soldiers.
- 1854 Florence Nightingale made sure that the hospitals were clean so saved many lives.
- 1855 Lots of people gave money to the Nightingale Fund to help train more nurses.
- 1856 The Crimean War ended.
- 1857 Florence Nightingale returned home.
- 1859 The Nightingale Training School was opened.
- 1883 Queen Victoria awarded Florence Nightingale The Royal Red Cross.
- 1910 Florence Nightingale died
